

INTRODUCTION

Our Club was founded in 1969 to cater for those owners of purebred dogs who were interested in training their dogs to Obedience Trial standard. The club was so successful in this regard that it was

granted affiliation with KCC (Kennel Control Council). In 1979 Victorian Canine Association (now Dogs Victoria) accepted all dogs into Obedience trials and the club was then also opened to all dogs.

CLUB RULES

- 1. Your dog is to be kept on leash at all times. The only exception is when given explicit instruction to work off lead in class.
- 2. Handlers wishing to leave their dogs tethered on Club grounds should only do so if their dogs are safe with people, especially around children. No dog may be tethered when it can reach another dog.
- 3. Dogs must be fully immunised before coming to classes which needs to be kept up-to-date.
- 4. Any sick dog, or one suffering from a communicative illness, are not to come to classes until Vet cleared.
- 5. Handlers are responsible for removal of their dogs' excreta from the training area.
- 6. We teach rewards-based training. Physical and excessive verbal abuse of dogs in not allowed. Any observed behaviour of this type will lead to expulsion from the club.
- 7. Instructors have authority over their classes and may ask a member to take their dog out of class if it is overly disruptive.
- 8. While at the grounds, before and after classes, please remain in control of your dogs, and respect the space of other dogs and handlers.
- 9. Dogs in season should not attend training for four weeks. However, this does not mean you should stop attending classes nor cease the training of your dog.
- 10. If an Instructor considers your dog to be aggressive, the Chief Instructor will evaluate your dog. If directed by ESODC, you agree that your dog must wear a yellow bandana/coat and/or soft muzzle while training and participating in club activities.

Committee and rule updates

Following on this years AGM and on the final committee meeting of the year there are a few changes to our front information page. Tamara has stepped down as Treasurer and will be replaced by Sokhun Lim, she plans to continue as our Chief Instructor though and will be aided by our other new Committee member Bec Carlin, who will be coordinating all our classes and Instructors in the new year.


We would like to thank Tamara for all the work she has put in as Treasurer over the last two years.

President's Report

A sincere thank you to all my committee this year, we have achieved a great deal as a team, and I could not have completed any of it without your support. What another year of change it has been, both for the club, and each of us as individuals... The following list covers just a few of this year's highlights.

- Constantly reviewing our training material, we are currently trialling a new Intermediate practical class. This class focuses on the exercises that members learnt in class, but aren't yet competent in performing. We also added ring craft training, and Rally sign classes too.
- We expanded our group of instructors, adding 5 more graduates.
- We ran our Open Obedience and Rally Trial in October with 113 DV competitors. 9 competitors being our own members, many entering a trial for their very first time. Cudos to you all.
- 12 club members now trial their own dogs successfully across 11 different sporting disciplines, (with interest building in a further three).
- Amazingly we only battled truly wet weather on two occasions this year, with decent weather holding for most Sunday morning's training.
- We were again successful in receiving a WCC grant. This year, \$1000 to (partially) fund new on-field training equipment/posts/mini agility. We need to create space in the storage room first, so watch for some new purchases on field for the commencement of 2026.



- We maintain 5 trained first aiders on the field every week, with our defib securely stored in the clubrooms, (hopefully never to be needed).
- We've added a cap and vest to our club uniform, with our instructors proudly in uniform on-field every Sunday.
- We've created an amazing brochure outlining our club activities, and have since reprinted it due to demand.
 Brochures have been distributed to the WCC, and all our local pet stores/vets/grooming salons.
- We've utilised social media to communicate more frequently to our members, adding Instagram to our existing Facebook account.
- We have also streamlined our member joining process to include an online application form, collecting clearer data for ongoing (better) club communications.
- 6 issues of our Newsletter have been created and delivered via email, website and Facebook to all members.
- We participated in WCC Spring Fest, putting on an amazing display of obedience, rally, and a variety of tricks. And, handed out quite a few of our new brochures.

 We continue to provide wonderful weekly instruction for our members, and in turn they are doing amazing, growing their own dog handling skills. It is a joy to watch the improvements over "just a few weeks" in the capabilities of both the handlers and their dogs.

So much change, and so much more to come. So, what are we still working towards?

- Priority for 2026 will be our new, smart-phone capable website, with a nice to have members only section where our governance documents can be accessed, and where our training material (both our class content, and trainee instructor's course material) can be viewed, and reviewed.
- A closer relationship with WCC, particularly Animal Management.
- And, more Family Fun Days, where we blend the obedience training with even more fun.....

I especially love that we are still considered a small Community based Dog Club, and yet achieve the results that we do. We are friendly, supportive and always ready to help with advice or attention whenever we can. We are tiny in comparison to our bigger neighbouring clubs, but achieve great training results for our members.



I am proud of my committee and eternally grateful to their commitment to our club, and to me personally. We have all worked hard and consistently throughout the year, and being a 100% volunteer workforce, we are all driven to make this the best experience for ourselves, and our members. Thank you to each and every one who helps and contributes. Thanks especially to our ground crew for setting up everything we need, every single Sunday morning. Thanks to all our instructors, both official and unofficial for your help, advice and support towards all our members. You truly don't know the value of what you consistently offer, but I do...Thank you.

Last, but not least, thank you for the opportunity to lead this great club into yet another year of fun, training adventures and all things dog!
